

## Annual Library Service Plan - FY 2023 - 2024

## Echo Public Library

<u>Library Vision for the Future</u> - The Echo Public Library's community encompasses not only the areas within the city limits, but also encludes the entire surrounding area. We work diligently to serve our community as well as planning for the future. We strive to improve the effectiveness of our welcoming atmosphere in our library everyday.

The Echo Public Library must consider not only the present needs of the community, but must try to anticipate future needs in order to give timely service. We also strive to listen to all of our patrons, young and old alike. Though the library attempts to give the best service possible to its regular users, it also has an obligation to update its collections and search for methods of service that will satisfy the needs of those in the community who have not traditionally been library users.

<u>Goal # 1</u>: K-5 Youth Programs - Focused on establishing/maintaining a lifelong relationship between the youth and the public library. By doing this we are hoping to foster a love of learning and reading in a safe atmosphere.

**Encourage participation**: The librarian will continue to work with the Echo School District and community members to provide information on what student interests are so that we can incorporate those ideas into real programs.

**Library Exposure:** The Echo School District does not have a library and that leaves the Echo Public Library to provide the only real exposure the students will get. This includes, but not limited to information on the collections, how to use the library and find items, library etiquette and much more. This year we have had some changes due to scheduling issues at the Echo School District and our monthly visits have not happened much. It is refreshing though, with this unexpected change that we have seen an uptick in younger families and children continuing to get library cards. Children that already have cards already continue to visit the library infrequently. We hope to resume class visits in the fall of 2024

**Summer Reading:** We will continue to offer a summer reading program that uses the IREAD by Librarians for Librarians this year and design activities, programs and select materials that closely support that theme.

Such a program not only exposes participating children to a variety of learning outlets including entertainment from actors both in person and digital that otherwise children in a small rural community might not be exposed to. Activities such as these help stimulate a good learning environment.

Using the experience and creativity of our staff we will design activities that are fun and educational for youth.

We will participating in the area wide library road trip again this and we hope create a few evening programs for our local and out of town visitors. Evening programs are challenging so we will be trying a couple to see how participation goes.

*Our Collection*: The theme will be used to aide in the selection of materials and supplies to help further learning activities.

**Story/Activity Time**: The library will continue to operate a weekly activity time and encourage participation by area children in the program which features activities and reading time for the children. We have been a little slow on getting a consistent groups of kids to participate, however we have seen a real increase in participation due to a homeschool program that uses our library a few times a month. We have a large space in our community center to provide adequate room for our story times and activities. As well as taking the fun outside to our City Park next to City Hall.

*Evaluation of programing:* We encourage parents to join their kids throughout the Summer Reading Program and on the last day we will provide a questionare for feedback on the current programing and possible future ideas we could utilitize.

**Priority(ies):** To encourage our young folks that the Library is an awesome place to come and feel safe.

**2023-2024 activities:** Continue all programing and activites outlined above. Our weekly craft time is very popular and we hope that it will keep growing.

<u>Goal # 2:</u> Adult Programs: Encourage them to come back to our library and enjoy the updated materials and seek new opportunities.

We now have an active Echo Book Club and get together to share our books and

thoughts. This past year the book club popularity has grown and I believe we have around 8 regular participants. Our librarian has engaged with our local garden club at their monthly luncheons. She puts on a presentations occasinally on different topics and it seems to be very popular with the ladies.

**Priority:** Continuing to build and keep trust with our community is very important in order to keep our programing moving forward. The Echo Public Library and the Echo School District are the focal points in the community and we need to find ways to build programing around these entities.

**Year 1 activities** Continue to refine a list of potential programs and activities. Outreach through the website, Facebook and a newsrelease to get input on community interests for programs.

**Year 2 activities:** Continue to add to list of potential program and presenters. Try to schedule at least one program per quarter. Publicize events.

**Year 3 and beyond activities:** Continue to add to list of potential program and presenters. Try to schedule at least one program every other month. Publicize events.
