Echo Public Library

<u>Library Vision for the Future</u>: The Echo Public Library's community encompasses not only the areas within the city limits, but also encludes the entire surrounding area. We work diligently to serve our community as well as planning for the future. We strive to improve the effectiveness of our welcoming atmosphere in our library everyday.

The Echo Public Library must consider not only the present needs of the community, but must try to anticipate future needs in order to give timely service. We also strive to listen to all of our patrons, young and old alike. Though the library attempts to give the best service possible to its regular users, it also has an obligation to update its collections and search for methods of service that will satisfy the needs of those in the community who have not traditionally been library users.

<u>Goal # 1</u>: K-5 Youth Programs - Focused on establishing/maintaining a lifelong relationship between the youth and the public library. By doing this we are hoping to foster a love of learning and reading in a safe atmosphere.

Encourage participation: The librarian will continue to work with the Echo School District and community members to provide information on what student interests are so that we can incorporate those ideas into real programs.

Library Exposure: The Echo School District does not have a library and that leaves the Echo Public Library to provide the only real exposure the students will get. This includes, but not limited to information on the collections, how to use the library and find items, library etiquette and much more. We have our monthly visists from K-5th grade at the library back in full swing post COVID. It is refreshing to have our local youth re-engaged in learning. Each class has their own library cards, which allows each student an opportunity to check out materials each time they visit. We have seen a slow up tick in new library cards, some of which are from students who visited during school hours.

Summer Reading: We will continue to offer a summer reading program that uses the IREAD by Librarians for Librarians this year and design activities, programs and select materials that closely support that theme.

Such a program not only exposes participating children to a variety of learning outlets including entertainment from actors both in person and digital that otherwise childerin in a small rural community might not be exposed to. Activities such as these help stimulate a good learning environment.

Using the experience and creativity of our staff we will design activities that are fun and educational for youth.

The Traveling Lattern Production is returning on June 14th, 2022 and we very excided to see what they have instore for the kids.

Our Collection: The theme will be used to aide in the selection of materials and supplies to help further learning activities.

Story/Activity Time: The library will continue to operate a weekly Story/Activity Time and encourage participation by area children in the program which features activities and reading time for the children. We have been a little slow on getting a consistent group of kids to participate lately, but hope to see more as we inch closer to the summer months. We have a large space in our community center to provide adequate room for our story times and activities. As well as taking the fun outside to our City Park next to City Hall.

Evaluation of programing: We encourage parents to join their kids throughout the Summer Reading Program and on the last day we will provide a questionare for feedback on the current programing and possible future ideas we could utilitize.

Priority(ies): To encourage our young folks that the Library is an awesome place to come and feel safe.

2023 activities: Continue all programing and activities outlined above.

<u>Goal # 2:</u> Adult Programs: Encourage them to come back to our library and enjoy the updated materials and seek new opportunities.


We now have an active Echo Book Club and get together to share our books and thoughts. We will keep the book club going as long participation stays strong.
