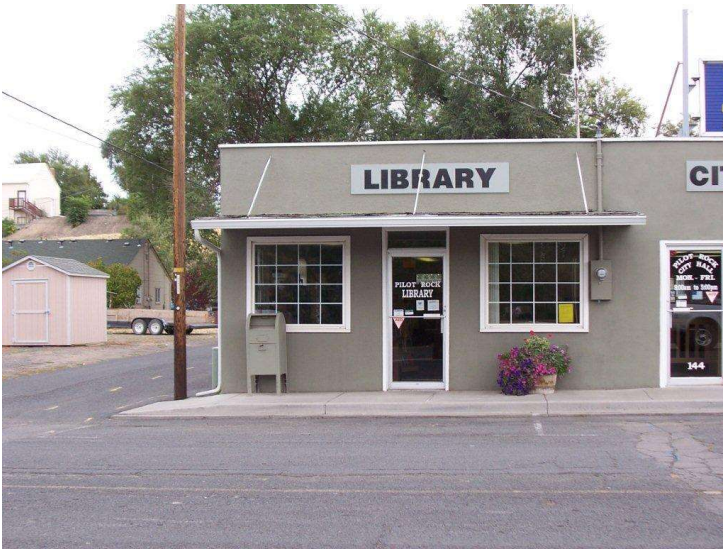


Fresh paint
