As young growing community the Hermiston Public Library is interested in the development of young readers and readers of all ages. To assist in this process we strive to enlist the participation of community business's and organizations to incentivize and engage participants with prizes and library programming. Nearly 50% of our community has Spanish speaking family members, and our Spanish language collection is used.

3. What goals did you accomplish in FY2021-22?

Our annual Summer Reading Program was active though not as much as we had hoped, and not to pre covid levels.

We are prepared to offer basic computer skills classes for the community, and will now that the library no longer competes with the city of use of the meeting room, those times will be scheduled shortly.

We had hoped that a collection analysis tool would assist in our effort to improve the Spanish language collection, we have since disengaged from that tool in hopes of finding another that will be more beneficial.

4. Share the challenges, if any, you had in meeting your plan's goals. What changes would you have made to better meet the needs in your community?

The biggest challenge to library use in the past year was recovering from COVID restrictions, lingering fears, frustration, cabin fever, and many outdoor activity opportunities.

The Hermiston Public Library is open to the public 54 hours in the average week. Each month the Director updates the community via KOHU radio station about activities and events at the library. The library has a somewhat active Facebook presence and is using other social media as well.
