Why did we choose to focus on these goals?





Closing the library in the spring of 2020 was a situation for which we were not prepared.

We need to evaluate that response so we can respond better in future emergency situations.

Increasing adult program attendance is a goal in its 3rd year, set in response to a 2018 community survey and the stated desires of the Library Board.

Working to build a solid middle and high school program is a goal born out of the stated desires of area teens. We also see it as a part of community initiatives advanced by the school district and other community organizations.



What goals did we accomplish?

- **Goal 1** is not accomplished because we remain in this emergency. However, we have kept a record of our actions and thoughts about those actions to help us as we continue working on emergency planning.
- We have kept an eye on **Goal 2** throughout the last 18 months of turmoil. Virtual trivia nights were well attended, our adult book club has reformed and is more vibrant than in the past and we focused on adult civics education during last fall's election season.
- **Goal 3** has been difficult in the face of limited opportunities for gather. Still, we have continued to upgrade and improve our teen room, we had a moderately successful teen summer reading program, and we continue to collaborate with the local high school whenever possible.


Patrons are out of the "habit" of coming to library programs making it difficult to re-start. This is also an opportunity to reimagine library service! 3


Library staff are struggling with burnout, depression, and other challenges. Future planning abilities are suffering.




Our first in person program in FY20/21 was by appointment in March. Oregon's Dino Story was a hit!

 the only information Athena citizens had before voting!


Creating Access for Everyone

Building a mobile library program with our new Book Bike. This helps facilitate deliveries to people who can't come to the library.


Creating passive programs. This helps us provide library programs to people who can't come to events with crowds.
