Library Vision for the Future:

Athena Public Library is a bold and vibrant part of Athena, Oregon. We support and develop programs and collections that contribute meaning and value to community life.

1. **Goal**: Technology in the Library

Needs Addressing:

- The library is a staple of our community and in our rural area, access to printing, faxing, and internet is vital to our patrons.
- Teaching teens and other members of our community how to use different technology that is available to them.
- Increase awareness of resources available to our community through our library.
- Lack of continuing education opportunities and resources.

Year 1 Activities:

- Work with the school district for training opportunities and to assess needs.
- Create informational flyers to be shared with Junior and Senior classes about resources available to them.
- Work to obtain grants for better printing and faxing services.
- Host or provide continuing education opportunities whenever possible and obtain feedback as to what training is desired from our community members.

2. **Goal:** Build mobile library services

Needs addressing:

The Athena Library now has a book bike, and will continue to build on this service. We have seen that taking services outside the library builds relationships, library services awareness, and offers a chance to reach those we do not normally see in the building.

Year 1 Activities

- Have the Book Bike regularly attend Tuesday Market.
- Write Book Bike Policies and Procedures and Best Practices
- Determine the best schedule for Book Bike to ensure consistency that patrons can rely on.
- Ride Book Bike in area parades.
- Track statistics to measure the success of the Book Bike.

Year 2 Activities

- Incorporate book bike hours into our regular schedule for spring and summer months
- Have opportunities to use the book bike for giveaway books.
- Evaluate the success of the Book Bike for future use.

3. Goal: K-12 Programs

Needs addressing:

- Increase attendance at weekly story time, with a focus on preschool and kindergarten readiness.
- Build positive relationships with teens in our community and create the Teen Advisory Board that was previously part of this goal.
- Area students have a community service requirement for graduation and many have expressed interest in fulfilling that requirement at the library.

Priorities:

Year 1 & 2 activities

- Teen internship summer of 2022.
- Get teen volunteers to assist with summer reading and create mentorship opportunities.
- Work to make our children's area a cozy place to stay and play.
 - additional seating in the children's section for parents.
- Continue upgrades and additions to Teen Room as budget/grant opportunities allow.
- Build Teen Advisory Board

- Build some inter-generational activities to create connections across the community.
- Support district teachers however possible.
 - o Continue to send welcome and introduction letter at the beginning of every school year.

 - Library field trips
